		This suit is for declaration of title and corresponding
		injunction over suit property detailed in the plaint. The
		plaintiffs claim that it was purchased by their predecessor
		from Mr. Muhammad Khan in the year 1990-91 and it has been in their use and possession since. They allege that
		defendants have recently begun illegal interference with
		suit property, and are attempting to forcibly appropriate it.

		of the plaintiffs. They claim that the land is their ancestral

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property and has been in their continuous possession since ages.

Arguments heard and record perused.

Reasons:

It is pertinent to begin with the observation that the district is yet to conduct its first land settlement. Consequently, it lacks revenue records and land surveys. The tribal mode of ownership through possession is largely in vogue, with very little traces of title documented with public authorities.

In these circumstances, the facts of the matter, and the merits of the claim or defense, could only be assessed from the pleadings of the parties, and the record annexed thereto.

Other than self-supporting claims of the plaintiffs, the only piece of particularized information supplied is the name of an alleged tenant, and copy of a purported DRC proceedings. On the other hand, defendants have annexed photographs showing them tilling the land manually.

In these circumstances, the court is inclined to balance the merits out by ordering maintenance of status quo for 06 months in the terms that cultivation or harvesting shall be done only with the leave and knowledge of the court. Violations shall be met with strict punitive action.
