**SUIT FOR DECLARATION & PERMANENT INJUNCTION**

**JUDGMENT**

09.01.2026

This judgment decides instant case filed by Mr. Ikram Ullah for correction of his date of birth in his record as maintained by the defendant.

**Pleadings:**

The claim as related in the plaint reads that correct date of birth of the plaintiff is 05.08.2010 while the defendant have erroneously recorded the same as 29.03.2022. It is further alleged that when defendant was requested to rectify the mistake extra-judicially, they declined, hence the suit.

Defendant was summoned who appeared

Senior Civil Judge through his representative Mr. Iftikhar Ahmad, who  
Orakzai Mela

submitted written statement.

During the scheduling conference within the meaning of order IX-A of CPC, it was revealed that the matter involved in the instant case involves simple adjudication, which can be decided through summary judgement as per relevant and admitted record.

To this effect notice was given to the parties that why not the case in hand be decided on the basis of available record without recording lengthy evidence, as the primary aim and objective of Amended Management Rules in CPC is, “*to enable the court to-*


- a. Deal with the cases justly and fairly;*
- b. Encourage parties to alternate dispute resolution procedure if it considers appropriate;*
- c. Save expense and time both of courts and litigants;*
- and*
- d. Enforce compliance with provisions of this Code.”*

Learned counsel for plaintiff and representative for the defendant heard and record gone through.

Record reveals that date of birth of the plaintiff according to his Birth Certificate is 05.08.2010, but the defendant has wrongly recorded the same as 29.03.2022.

The plaintiff appeared before the court. He is unmistakably a teenager. All present, including representative of the defendant concur on the point.

Furthermore, for all civil purposes, decrease in age offers academic and service benefits, and not

increase. Hence the presence of malafide can be ruled out safely.

In the situation at hand, the best solution, if not a good one, is to grant the prayer, so as to remove future complications.

Consequently, upon what has been discussed above and the jurisdiction vested in this court under order IX-A and XV-A of CPC, suit of the plaintiff succeeds and is hereby **decreed** as prayed for. Correct date of birth of the plaintiff is declared as 05.08.2010. Defendant is advised to bring his record in line with this judgment. Costs shall follow.
